- Organization of the CS1 final examination (final test)
 - There are <u>four</u> sections in the CS1 final test: Section I (Understanding Structures), Section II (Applying Strategies), Section III (Expressing Opinions), and Section IV (Vocabulary).
 - No listening comprehension test is included in the final test.
- Section I (Understanding Structures)
 - There are ten questions in this section, two questions from each unit (Unit 1 to Unit 5).
- Section II (Applying Strategies)
 - You will apply one of the structures you learned in the textbook and write a short conversation (role play).
- Section III (Expressing Opinions)
 - You will write an opinion about a given topic that is supported by two good reasons.
- Section IV (Vocabulary)
 - ➤ This section has twenty collocation questions based on "CS1 Weekly Vocabulary Lists with Collocations" (Week 1 to Week 14).
 - All the collocations in this section are taken from the collocation lists.
 - ➤ Each vocabulary question appears in the following form, where you are asked to choose the best word from A D that completes all three collocations on the left.
