Communication Strategies 2 (CS2) Final Examination Information

- Organization of the CS2 final examination (final test)
 - ➤ There are three sections in the CS2 final test: Section I (Understanding Structures), Section II (Expressing Opinions), and Section III (Vocabulary).
 - No listening comprehension test is included in the final test.
- Section I (Understanding Structures)
 - There are ten questions in this section, two questions from each unit (Unit 1 to Unit 5).
- Section II (Expressing Opinions)
 - You will write two opinions about given topics that meet the following conditions.
 - (1) Your opinions must have two reasons.
 - (2) Each reason must be supported by evidence.
 - (3) It must have a good <u>transition sentence</u>.
 - (4) It must have a good <u>concluding sentence</u>.

• Section IV (Vocabulary)

- ➤ This section has twenty collocation questions based on "CS2 Weekly Vocabulary Lists with Collocations" (Week 1 to Week 14).
- All the collocations in this section are taken from the collocation lists.
- For 10 questions, you are asked to choose the best word that completes all given collocations (from collocations to a word). For another 10 questions, you are asked to choose all phrases that make the best collocations with a given word (from a word to collocations).

• How to Prepare for the Final Test

- Review Unit 1 to Unit 5 of the CS2 textbook, along with the unit lecture videos. You need to pay close attention to the structure/strategy, examples, grammar review, and role plays in each unit.
